Chief Seattle (Suquamish/Duwamish) c. 1786-1866; important local leader; gave his famous farewell speech at 1884 Point Elliot treaty



council; written down by Dr. Henry Smith, first published in 1887; words revised by Ted Perry in 1972 for a film about pollution; lasting origin of environmental stereotype.

Playing Indian

access to the land base: wealth and resources; socalled public land (national parks, wilderness, etc);



place names and cultural survival; environmentalism can perpetuate invisibility of Native peoples.
